

HOW TO VOTE IF YOU TEMPORARILY RESIDE OUTSIDE OF NEW ORLEANS

Complete a Displaced Voter Affidavit

A Displaced Voter Affidavit is attached. The displaced voter affidavit allows you to extend the deadline for requesting and returning your absentee ballot. It also allows individual who registered between October 5, 2004 and September 24, 2005 and who are voting for the first time to vote absentee.

Complete a Request for an Absentee Ballot

A Request form is attached. You can also request a ballot by fax if you do not think the ballot will reach you in time by mail. You can mail or fax (with a signed and dated statement waiving your right to privacy) the ballot back to the Registrar of Voters at: Orleans Parish Registrar of Voters 1300 Perdido St. Rm 1W23, New Orleans LA 70112-2127 Fax: 504. 658.8315.

Complete and Return the Absentee Ballot:

Make sure that your absentee ballot is filled out completely, including:

- Your Name
- Your Orleans Parish Address
- Your Signature
- Signature of Two Witnesses (or a Notary) on the Envelope!

U + 2 (“You Plus Two”):

Remember to sign your ballot and have 2 witnesses (or a notary) sign your ballot envelop. In short, U + 2 make your vote count!!!
